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Nursery

Reception



In Reception, we have become historians and are investigating the past and comparing how some things are different in the present. We have explored photographs and artefacts, which we learnt are objects from the past, to help us with our investigations. We have

screen. We have also enjoyed learning to use a new tool to help us in maths called rekenreks. We have been learning to move the beads with just one finger, to help us with our counting, subitising and composition of numbers.

created models using just art straws and tape.




Year 2

Year 3



In our DT projects we were exploring levers and linkages. The children researched different levers and linkages and tested a few different ideas out before creating their final design. They then made a prototype to test out their final design, making any changes that they needed to. Lastly, they

Year 4

May saw the start of our Harry Potter unit in English. We have started reading the first book in the series and our English unit was about wizarding descriptions. We are now learning to write newspapers and are using events from Harry Potter to help us. In our classrooms, owls and wands have been arriving. We are also continuing our science unit on Living things and habitats.

Year 5



In Science we have been learning about the lifecycle and propagation of plants. We carried out an investigation to find out which parts of the plant propagate best. We took cuttings from pansies and mint from their petals, stem, leaves and roots and planted each of these. We



watered and observed them over two weeks and discovered that the leaf

and stem of the mint propagated the best.

Year 6



Year 6 have been having lots of fun during their Enterprise project. Their aim was to design and run a stall with the aim of making a profit. Each group was given a budget of £10 which they had to use to buy resources and prizes and



rent equipment. They marketed their new business by pitching their game during assembly and advertising it around the school with posters. On Thursday 6th June, they worked really hard in selling their games to children across the whole school before counting up their profit. £337 was made which will be donated to Isabel Hospice.



Anti-Abuse Curriculum

In order to embed the Anti-Abuse Curriculum into our teaching, each half term we are focusing on one theme which we will discuss in our classrooms during snack and discussion time. This half term, we are focusing on **Character and personal values.** Some objectives link closely with our PSHE topics as well as our discussion on the Emotion of the Month. Here are just some of the things we have been discussing across the school:

- I know that helping others can make me feel good about myself, but in helping others I should not put my own safety, wellbeing and future at risk.
- I know that my choices and behaviours have consequences and that I can change my behaviours and choices.

- I know the importance of a growth mind-set and approaching life with optimism to help me achieve my goals.
- I can reject pressure to join in with hurtful and immoral behaviour.
- I have confidence in my ability to decide when to be compassionate and when to challenge and confront.
- I have skills and strategies to help encourage understanding when friends fall out.
- I know that fulfilling my potential requires the development of judgement, morality and integrity.

At home, why not speak with your child about what important qualities they look for in a friend and why showing kindness and care to everyone is important. It would be useful to discuss 'peer pressure' and the importance of standing up for yourself and others in an appropriate way.

Online Safety

For June, our theme is health, well-being and lifestyle.

For EYFS / KS1, please have some discussions around rules to stay safe when using devices and the importance of not having too much screen time.

For KS2, please have some discussions about:

- the positive and negative impact technology can have
- the pressures that technology can place on people through adverts, wanting latest technology, wanting messages / comments to be 'liked'

Online Safety - Mental Health

For children in Years 5 and 6, despite having an age rating of 16+, the use of WhatsApp and other messaging apps are increasingly popular. Over the past couple of years, we have noticed a huge increase in the number of children who they are having a negative effect on affecting their mental health, concentration and wellbeing.

The issues arise especially within large group chats. Common issue include: Children posting unpleasant messages about each other, removing / adding others to groups without their permission, excluding individuals from conversations. Sometimes, it is not individual messages that are unkind, but the frequency of non-positively phrased messages which children struggle to cope with.

Please help support your children by:

Ensuring sufficient parental controls / privacy settings are in place.

Monitoring their messages. Are they posting messages which are unkind? Are they receiving unpleasant messages?

Ensure they know how to block individuals.

Report more serious unpleasantries, or continued abuse to the police.

Remove them from groups which have a large number of people.

For inappropriate messages within games, ensure they know how to report this to the game company.

Emotional Literacy

Our focus emotion for this half term is Fear.

With change can come feelings of fear of the unknown along with excitement for the future.

This half term our children will be learning about how fear feels in their bodies and learning new ways to cope when feeling afraid.



Please talk to your child about how fear is a normal feeling and that we all feel scared at times.

Term time holidays

We are unable to authorise term time holidays. Absence can only be authorised if a child is unwell. If however, the number of unauthorised sessions reaches 15 or more within 2 terms, the local authority may issue you with a Penalty Notice. The Penalty Notice requires parents to pay a fine of £60 within 21 days. If this is not paid within the time limit, the penalty rises to £120 which must be paid within 28 days.

Term time holidays have a negative impact on friendships and learning. Please avoid taking your child out of school. Term time holidays are not authorised. Absence requests can only be authorised is there are exceptional, unrepeatable circumstances. Section 7 Education Act 1996 places a duty on parents to ensure that their child of compulsory age attends school.
