English

In Guided Reading this term, we will be revising all 8 reading domains, with a larger focus on inference and strategies for quicker and accurate recall of answers.

In writing, we will produce texts from different genres including: persuasion and a non-chronological report.

We will continue to revise and introduce grammar and punctuation aspects such as causal conjunctions and modal verbs.

In Spelling, we will be focusing on: words

ending endings includiing —el, -cial, -tial, -cially, -tially, able/ably, -ible/ibly, -cious and -tious.

3 o'clock Book: Street Child

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths we will need to use all of our times tables and number facts knowledge to revise and extend all Maths topics.

This term we will be learning about fractions including finding equivalent fractions, comparing and ordering and adding and subtracting fractions.

We will remind ourselves all four operations and apply our skills to solving problems. We will learn how to measure accurately convert measurements, for example 1200grams is 1.2kg and calculate the area and perimeter of shapes.

We will begin to understand more about percentages and solve problems using percentages.

Finally, we will continue our learning in 2D and 3D shape.



Science

The first topic is 'Earth and Space'. We will begin by looking at how ideas of the shape of the earth evolved from the Flat Earth theory to Spherical Earth theory.

We will recognise the different planets and their position within the solar system. We will learn about the movement of the Earth and other planets relative to the sun and how this has developed and the movement of the moon in relation to Earth.

The second topic, 'Changing States' - we will learn that some materials will dissolve in liquid to form a solution. We will develop our understanding of how solids, liquids and gases might be separated and understand the processes. We will test the suitability of everyday materials including woods, metals, plastics for

In PE we continue to develop our learning in Dance, Gymnastics, Handball and Hockey.

Music

This half term we will compose Rock music using the app 'Garage Band'. We will listen to classic guitar and drum riffs from the 1970s and 80s and create our own.

Then we will add layers of key instruments to improve the 'Texture'.

Computing

Our first Computing topic this term is 'Flat File Databases'. We will learn how they can be used to organise data in records, use tools within a database to order and answer questions about data and create graphs and charts to help solve problems.

In our second topic 'Vector Drawing', we will learn that images in vector drawings are created using shapes and lines.

Our last topic is 'Coding'. We will explore selection through the use of the Crumble programming environment. We will revisit



how 'conditions' can be used in programming and how the 'if... then... else...' structure can be used to select different outcomes.

PSHE

Our first PSHE topic is 'Dreams and Goals'. In this unit we will look at jobs that people they know do, look at the fact that some jobs pay more money than others and reflect on what types of jobs we might like to do when we are older.

After half term, we study 'Healthy Me'. We will be taught a range of basic emergency procedures (including the recovery position) and learn how to contact the emergency services when needed. We will look at how body types are portrayed in the media, social media and celebrity culture.

Our topic will be on 'My Home'- using key sounds to learn to say, read and write types of homes, rooms and furniture. We will be producing a short text answering the guestion 'Où habites-tu? '. We will improve our answers by adding appropriate adjectives and prepositions.



R.E

Our RE topic this term is 'Rites of passage'. Initially, we will discuss what the journey of life is before learning about Jesus' baptism and the importance of baptism. We will also be learning about a variety of Christian and Jewish traditions including Bar Mitzvah/Bat Mitzvah and marriage and looking at religious texts.

We will be able to express our own views as well as learn from others.

Forest School

This term, we will aim to create and evaluate a tipi shelter with camouflage in groups. This will allow us to develop our knot tying skills. This activity is weather dependent.

We will also have the opportunity to develop our whittling skills.



D&T

This term we are learning to make cam toys which will be the project for the whole term. We need to research cam toys, test different cam movements and design our own mechanical cam toy.

We will then need to practice our woodwork skills including measuring, sawing, sanding

and joining.

Building our cam toy will takes us some time but we will be improving our skills and learning from our mistakes as we go.

Finally, when our cam toy is complete we will evaluating how the process went. whether we made changes along the way, what we are proud of and what we would do differently next time.

Reminders:

Reading—read daily, recording reading as much as possible. Question stems are in the back of the reading records for you to use to aid your questioning at home.

Times Tables— these are tested weekly on Thursdays, each child knows which one they are currently on.

Spellings - these are also tested weekly on Thursdays. The children have their spellings in their small blue books each week.
